

Reader in Classical Literature, University of Oxford, 1978-85

Professor of Classical Literature, University of Oxford, 1985-88, Emeritus since 1988

Winterbottom), 1972; Plutarch, 1972; Menander Rhetor (with N.G. ### THE PORTRAIT PROJECT

Five of Donald Russell's old friends listed below, all but one of them former pupils, in consultation with St John's College, the University's Classics Faculty and Donald himself, decided last autumn to commission an oil portrait of Donald as a tribute to the colossal contributions which he has made to Classical scholarship and teaching over an astonishing period of 70 years.

We invited Mark Hancock to paint the portrait. We hope that others will be as delighted with Mark's work as we are.

We decided that the portrait should be presented to St John's College and the Classics Faculty. It was agreed between all the parties that the College would own the portrait but make it available on permanent loan to the Faculty for as long as the Faculty is willing and able to display it suitably. The portrait will hang, accordingly, in the Ioannou Centre where the Faculty is housed.

Although our little group would have been happy to finance the project ourselves, we thought that a better plan, more faithfully reflecting the extraordinary breadth and depth of esteem in which Donald is held, would be to associate with the project a wider group of his special friends, colleagues, co-authors and former pupils, in Oxford and across the world. So we invited over a hundred of them to contribute to the project as well if they would like to.

The response to our invitation has been tremendous. About 120 of Donald's close friends, colleagues and former pupils have together contributed some £6,000. Messages of admiration and affection for Donald have poured in alongside, and Donald himself has been deeply touched. The contributors are listed on the following pages.

The portrait with related expenses (artist fees & expenses, frame, photographs, booklet) has cost about half of the total sum contributed. In accordance with Donald's wishes, the remaining half will go to the College's Ancient World Fund, which supports Classical Fellowships at the College.

We wish to thank all concerned — Donald himself, Mark the artist, the College, the Faculty, and the contributors — for coming together in the magnificent way they have to bring this project to such a happy conclusion.
