How much do I pay and when?

The Financial Declaration contains fee information and who is paying those fees

□ Student loan? Apply when you get the FDF

Self-funded? Proof of funds, bank statements, letters from parents or professional bodies

 \square Fees paid at the start of 1st term, accommodation paid each term \square

Battels (= bill) issued start of term with charges

□ Settled via our finance portal or our payment facilitator (Flywire) by debit card or bank transfer

Food and Accommodation

- \square St John's rents (2024-25) range from £1,131.81 to £1,394.03 per term.
- □ Fixed charge of £264.70 per term for general services
- Rooms allocated randomly

Meals are paid as in any restaurant or café, debit card at the till

□ OR via your bod card, which can be pre-loaded with funds

What financial support do you provide?

Crankstart Scholarships and Oxford Bursaries (household income assessed)

St John's offers smaller grants (academic, blues squad, travel)

And what happens if I am struggling to pay?

Oxford Assistance Fund and St John's Assistance Fund for financial hardship as a result of unexpected circumstances

Important to come to us as soon as possible to talk about options for repayment
